The board meeting of the Friends of the Forest Preserve of DuPage County was held at the Preserve at Oak Meadows, 900 N. Wood Dale Rd., Addison IL

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Diane Addante at 5:30 pm.

Roll Call

Chair's Welcome - Diane Addante, Chair

- Acknowledged those in attendance including President Daniel Hebreard, Members of the Board of Commissioners, Executive Director Friling, District staff, volunteers and donors.
- The board works with the District's Partnership and Philanthropy staff.
- Welcome Friends' Board Members

President Hebreard comments.

Thanked donors, celebrating the idea of public-private partnership to accomplish the important work of caring for our 60 forest preserves, seven education and cultural centers, and 26,000 acres.

Public Comment – No public comment was offered.

Mission Moment - Kevin Horsfall, Director of Planning and Development

Update on the progress of Willowbrook Wildlife Center. We are in stage 2. Phase A was completed in May 2023 with 3 outdoor enclosures – raptor barn, large and small carnivore, and a resident dormitory. We are in the process of phase B1-B3. Clinic and visitor soft open Summer/early Fall 2024. Ribbon Cutting Spring 2025. About 30% of project to be financed by private donations and grants.

Jeannine Kannegiesser

Project will be completed through public-private partnership. The District has been proactive in applying for grants. The Friends have raised \$207,000 towards the \$500,000 commitment over two years ending in 2024. Celebrating the organizations and individuals as leaders with their contributions for this project and the ongoing work at Willowbrook Wildlife Center.

The Friends year end appeal will continue to highlight Willowbrook Wildlife Center.
